


Flower Grading Standards

Our Grading system provides a standard way of describing flowers being sold in the Realtime Marketplace.

We use a 3 digit number to describe the different parts of the flower, the first is the flower head, the second is the foilage/leaves and the third number represents the stem. The higher the number, higher quality can be expected. So, a grading FLOWER:LEAVES:STEMS, for example, 9:7:8 means the flower is a good size, tight and clean, the leaves have good colour with young tips and that the stem is slightly bent but clean.
